Mark Mills Las Vegas Metro Police Department S.W.A.T Team (Ret) with 14.5 of his 20 years assigned to the SWAT Team. As an operator Mark participated in over 3,000 High Risk / Critical



Search Warrants and over 650 Tactical situations involving barricaded gunmen and the arrest of armed and dangerous suspects, later supervising over 700 missions as a team leader. Throughout his tenure with LVMPD SWAT he was instrumental in developing training rotations in firearms, close quarter battle skills, high risk and covert entry skills, dignitary protection high risk/ low risk environment,

explosive breaching, gas and pyrotechnic deployment. Mark developed outside training for agencies such as F.B.I, U.S Marshals and the Anti -terrorism Assistance Program. Other duties within LVMPD included; Assisted, developed, instructed and critiqued the Active Shooter Program to the entire Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. Assisted, developed, instructed and critiqued the Advanced Officer Training Program to the entire Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. Instructed and critiqued International Police Departments at the LVMPD Explosive Breacher School hosted by LVMPD S.W.A.T. Instructed and critiqued LVMPD Academy Recruits. Lead Instructor for the LVMPD Intermediate S.W.A.T. School. Instructed and critiqued military and civilian personnel at the Naval Facility Engineering Service Center Antiterrorist Program. Mark is a two time recipient of LVMPD highest commendation the Medal of Valor. In 2003 he was named LVMPD SWAT entry man of the year and LVMPD SWAT Team MVP of the year in 2009. Mark is currently participating in an overseas Police Mission in Afghanistan as an embedded police mentor.

Joe Deedon was employed as a Law Enforcement Officer with the Jefferson County Sheriff's



Office, Colorado, from 08/2002 to 06/2010. He was a tactical operator with the Jefferson County Regional SWAT team from 2005 -2009. Joe is a Kaminsky certified FTO and last assignment was in the Patrol Division where he trained newly assigned patrol Deputies. He has also instructed newly hired Officers and Deputies from around the metro area that attend a Regional P.O.S.T. certified Academy in the following areas; Building Searches, RAID, Traffic Stops and Crowd Control. In November of 2006 Joe received the Distinguished Service Medal and the Park County Sheriff's Commendation for his actions during the Platte Canyon High School incident. In May of 2007 Joe received the Medal of Valor for his actions during an officer involved shooting with a barricaded gunman. In

May of 2008 Joe received the Distinguished Service Medal for his involvement in a high speed chase and apprehension of a shooting suspect. In May of 2010 he was awarded a life saving medal for his actions while assisting the West Metro fire department. In February of 2011 Joe completed a mission in Afghanistan with the Marine Corp as an Embedded Police Mentor. Since 2007 Joe has built, coordinated and conducted active shooter and S.W.A.T. training for officers from over fifty different agencies in seven states, as owner and lead instructor of TAC*ONE Consulting.
