In consideration of accepting my voluntary entry, I, intending to be legally bound, do hereby for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators agents or assigns, do agree to hold harmless, indemnify, waive and release forever, any and all rights and claims for damages I may accrue against all persons and agencies, including the Jackson Police Department, City of Jackson a/k/a Town of Jackson and Wyoming Special Olympics, and their affiliates, subsidiaries, owners, officers, directors, agents, employees, agencies and any sponsors involved with promoting the race as listed by their successors, representatives, and assigns from any and all judgments, claims, suits, losses, damages, expenses and for any and all injuries suffered by me, resulting from, related to or in any what connected to with my travel to and from and participation in the Law Enforcement Torch Run on May 23, 2009 in Jackson, Wyoming, including any claims my and their heirs, executors, agents or assigns may have relating to any loss or injury I or they may suffer, even if such injury is caused by negligence, passive or active, or arises from any other cause. At its most basic level, the Torch Run is an actual running event in which officers and athletes run the "Flame of Hope" to the Opening Ceremonies of local Special Olympics competitions, state/provincial Games, and National Summer or Winter Games. The Law Enforcement Torch Run® began in 1981 when Wichita, Kansas (USA), Police Chief Richard LaMunyon saw an urgent need to raise funds for and increase awareness of Special Olympics. The Torch Run was quickly adopted by the International Association of Chiefs of Police, now recognized as the founding law enforcement organization of the Law Enforcement Torch Run® for Special Olympics.
